#### ~From Pastor Rev. Greta MacRae

"Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for thereby some have entertained angels unawares." Hebrews 13:2 "...for I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not

give me clothing, sick and in prison and you did not visit me." Matthew 25:42-44

My dear congregation,

Rev. Patty Kogut wrote a letter to some of our area churches this week urging folks to have a look around their buildings and to see them through the eyes of someone visiting for the first time. Her point was that at this time of year churches do get visits from strangers (angels?!) and that there are things we can do that will help people feel more welcome.

This had been on my mind even before I read Patty's letter. With our sign out front inviting children to enroll in Sunday School on Rally Day, my upcoming installation service and especially those people who use our building day to day from A.A. to Girl Scouts to the nesting churches to our cleaning people to workers who come in to service the AT&T tower or our boiler, we have the opportunity to make anyone feel more comfortable in this house of God.

The second passage calls those ancient people who came before us to task for not doing what they could have done to welcome and heal and minister to those in need. The two passages hold up mirrors for us to take a good look and to respond.

Now, I am not scolding. Our congregation has turned itself inside out accepting with good grace and generosity how our church is changing even when it has been hard and uncomfortable. What I am asking is for us to look at signage for entrances and exits as well as bathrooms, which could be more helpful in several languages. I have been walking around the church and looking at bulletin boards that have not been changed in years. I have encouraged people to see the old name tag boards that serve no purpose but to remind us of long -ago days. All these things could be freshened up and made more current with just a little effort and would more accurately reflect what goes on in our church these days.

Jeff Kroesen and Sue Capistran recently updated the leadership bulletin board. Take a look! Now we can easily see who represents our church on boards and committees. Today a bulletin board with pictures of Luis and Carmelita's house went up. The front foyer is next. Let's make it warm, current, and helpful. Perhaps we could even make a sign saying, "Angel's welcome here."

### **A NOTE FROM SUE CAPISTRAN**


As some of you already know, I have decided to take early retirement. My husband makes retirement look so good that I want to get in on the fun!
