#### ~From Pastor Rev. Greta MacRae

"And don't forget the foreigner who is not a member of your people Israel but has come from a far country because of your reputation. People are going to be attracted by your great reputation, your wonder working power, who come to pray at this Temple." 1 Kings 8:41-43

My Dear Congregation,

Barbara lifted the prayer above this past Sunday in worship. Her prayer could not have been timelier. Monday evening the pastors of two of our nesting churches gathered. We usually meet every month to keep communication and relationship growing between the churches. Jeff Kroesen, Jim Stoney, and I met with Pastor Euclides Anjos and Pastor Carlos Jerez who was representing Pastor Melchor Guacho, with the hope that we could all talk about the current campaign to fund the boiler repair as well as some housekeeping issues. What we experienced was something far different.

As we put forward our request for help, Pastor Euclides, whom some of you know as Angel, shared the heartbreaking challenges his congregation is facing. Three families from the Brazilian church have received deportation notices and are now preparing to be sent back to Brazil. This means that every bit of their resources is being saved for their departure and to get them settled as they return to Brazil. None of those families choose this return. They are never sure when ICE (Immigration and Customs Enforcement) might come to their homes and take them into custody. The reason we were meeting very quickly shifted to one of listening. Pastor Carlos shared that the Ecuadorian congregation is experiencing much the same. Pastor Euclides told us, "(Deportation) is the ghost we fight every day."

After the meeting, Jeff and Jim and I stood in the hallway in a kind of stunned silence. The boiler fell down the ladder of things we thought of as important. It is still something we need to address and to pay for. However, when we began the transition from the idea of being just landlords to the idea of being friends in Christ who share the same building, the shift was towards relationship building. Now we know the names and faces of individual people, and we are getting to know families and three vastly different cultures.

What we can do right now is to hold these congregations in our prayers and to ask God for hearts soft enough to see their pain. For some, this will seem like a political issue. I do not see it that way. I see this as an opportunity to keep learning how the love of Christ might be lived out in the community of Milford which has, from its beginning, been a town where people from far away have chosen to settle and build a new life.
