"Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, you will see these things taking place, you will know that the kingdom of God is near."

My Dear Congregation,

We enter Advent on Sunday. We move into Year C of the Revised Common Lectionary and the gospel of Luke will be our focus for 2025. Scripture, this week, is about looking for signs, staying alert, being ready; it's about being open to see change through small cues that will alert us to something new growing. Surely that is happening here in our congregation. Here's what I see: new people taking on leadership roles, including some of our young adults, and some old friends of the church who have been noticing our need for help and have stepped up to offer assistance.

That's growth as visible as the new shoots on my fiddle leafed fig tree. I rescued that plant from the side of the road and it has taught me how to care for it—it's a persnickety plant. It likes filtered light, enough water—but not too much—and good soil. I placed it in the shaded part of my backyard this summer and it flourished! It's fun to find ways of supporting an organism so that it can be its best self and that reminds me of a community of faith. We can flourish if we pay attention to the small things that are appearing amongst us but we have to keep watch and respond. Two things in particular have my attention: online worship and religious education for adults.

This past Sunday I led worship online on Facebook. It was not without glitches—I had to switch to my own Facebook page when I couldn't get our page to record but the number of people who watched and commented from outside our community stunned me. I believe we are being called to create a team of digital deacons. We could grow our church online something the nesting churches have been nudging us to do!

I miss teaching Bible study. Every year I choose two things to focus on as a way of growing personally. This year one of my goals will be religious education and I'm hoping each of you will join me for at least one chapter of this pursuit. January will focus on Mitch Albom's book, "Have a Little Faith." It's about a little church in Detroit that committed to a ministry to the homeless. There were many challenges and lots of walking in faith. It's an inspiring read. For those of you who might be interested, send me a message and I'll order the book for you if you can't find it. We'll agree on a time during the second week of January.

In the meantime, give thanks for all God has done for you and our congregation. We have so many blessings. The more we notice the more we see and can give thanks for.



- ♥ *Diapers:* Especially sizes 4, 5, and 6 (generic is fine)


